## BRIAN STEADMAN, PROMOTED TO PUBLIC WORKS SUPERINTENDENT

City Manager Linda Hall announced the promotion of Brian Steadman to the position of City of Milton-Freewater Public Works Superintendent on July 24, 2017. Brian follows in the footsteps of long-tenured Public Works Superintendent David Bradshaw, who retired in April of this year after 28 years of service the Public Works Department with the City of Milton-Freewater.

Brian has been employed within the City's Public Works Department since 2011 when he was hired as a Public Works Technician. Prior to that, he worked in the City's engineering and planning departments where he worked as an engineering technician on several large city projects, including the complete renovation and reconstruction of North Main street system, and the conversion of a commercial kitchen and incubator "flex space" rental in the South

Main area.

Brian, a graduate of McLoughlin Union High School in Milton-Freewater, also achieved two Associate of Applied Science Degrees-one in Computer Aided Drafting Technology, and the other in Civil Engineering. Brian also holds certificates in the Public Works Association of America's Developing Leader program as well as Project Management Certificate from the League of Oregon Cities. He brings advanced training in AutoCAD and G.I.S. certificates as well as significant experience in Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition systems known as SCADA. Brian is active in the community, volunteering with several civic service clubs as well as serving as a volunteer firefighter.

City Manager Linda Hall states Brian's experience, knowledge and strong community dedication made him an outstanding candidate for Public Works Superintendent. The Public Works Department is a large and complex department responsible for the Water, Sewer, and Solid Waste Utilities, parks and recreation operations, landfill and wastewater land application operations, motor pool and fleet management, public buildings and facilities, Streets, Storm water Management, and several other operations.
