A Friendly Reminder

In the Oregon Driver Manual, it says, "You must yield right of way to emergency vehicles, such as fire trucks, police vehicles and ambulances, when they approach from any direction using a light or siren. When you see or hear an emergency vehicle warning, you must immediately drive as close as you safely can to the right side of the road and stop. Do not stop in an intersection. Do not drive or stop in a way that interferes with these vehicles. Stay stopped until the emergency vehicle has passed or until an officer tells you to move. After the emergency vehicle passes, you must stay at least 500 feet behind the vehicle."

NEED HELP BUDGETING YOUR UTILITY BILL? Join our Equal Pay Plan—also known as Budget Plan. Here's how it works We compute the that past 12 months of your utilities used (must live at current resident one year). The total of your previous year's utilities with your account balance at the time of your May statement, are divided into 2 equal payments (NOTE: If your account balance at the time of your May statement is more than \$50, you may not qualify for the Equal Pay Plan). If you qualify, your first payment will be on your May statement. Each May, your budget amount will be recalculated. Adjustment may be made within the budget year should the budget amount not cover the increased usage. Budget amounts are required to be paid each month. Non-payment of a budget amount may cause you to lose the privilege of participating. Your final billing for the budget year will be issued in April and will need to be paid in full unless it is a CREDIT. IMPORTANT! If you were on last year's EQUAL PAY PLAN, you will be put on the next year's plan automatically, as long as your account balance at the time of your May statement is less than \$501.00. Should you NOT wish to continue on the plan, please note below.
