ISSUE: Work Session – Discussion of System Expansion Funding Addendum Application with Greg Ryan, Oregon Recycling Manager at Circular Action Alliance (CAA).

BACKGROUND: In May, staff was authorized to proceed with submitting our application for a System Expansion Addendum to be drafted by CAA. Once the addendum was drafted, the council was assured that it would come back before them for final review and consideration of signature approval.

COMMENTARY/ANALYSIS: As a reminder, the System Expansion Addendum will allow for the acquisition of trucks(s) and carts for curbside co-mingled recycling to be funded by CAA and delivered to the City under the RMA. This funding is a one-time opportunity involving OVER a million dollars of assets, so we want to be sure we get it right!

Since the May City Council meeting and the submission of our application, staff has been notified by Greg Ryan and Tonya Allison with CAA of a different vision of how our program could work and how funding could be granted under the addendum. Upon hearing their suggestions and ideas, I requested a work session with CAA to be present with City Council to share, discuss, and work to establish a vision of how this could and should look for Milton-Freewater moving forward.
