Once the holidays are over many find themselves needing more space in their trash can. **STOP!** Consider recycling to save room in your trash can for those other non-recyclable items.

We recycle:

Glass
Scrap metal
Used Motor Oil
Christmas Trees
Appliances (metal)
Tin & Aluminum Cans
Corrugated Cardboard

All you need to do is prepare it, drop it by one of our depots and sort it.

<u>Corrugated Cardboard</u> – <u>CLEAN, flattened corrugated cardboard only please</u>. Sorry no waxed paper boxes, they have to go in the trash.

- 1. Remove all packing materials, tissue and wrapping paper and bag & tie them and then place them in your trash.
- 2. Break down and flatten all corrugated cardboard boxes so they are flat.
- 3. Haul them to one of our drop off depots during open hours and place them in the designated bin.

Glass, aluminum and tin – bring to one of our depots and drop them off at no charge.

- 1. Bring them to a depot
- 2. Unload and sort them into the proper container
- 3. You just did the right thing and recycled as well as saved room in your trash for all that added holiday wrapping paper, etc. YAY!

<u>Televisions & Computers</u> – Oregon DEQ recognizes these items as E-cycle waste and they are NOT allowed in the landfill! The only thing it costs you to get rid of them is a little time and a quick drive. It is easy...

- 1. It is FREE!
- 2. Take them to Humbert Refuse and Recycling at 54841 Hwy 332 (also known as Sunnyside Road right behind the drive in theater) Tuesday Thursday 10 a.m. to 12 Noon.
- 3. Drop them off in the designated area in front of their office building.

<u>Christmas Trees</u> - Once all decorations and stands are removed place them in the street in front of your home January 2nd through 4th and crews will come pick them up for free during these dates. Trees placed after these dates may incur a fee for removal.

Save time and garbage overcharge fees!

- 1. Bag your garbage and tie the bags before disposing it in the trash can. This helps keep litter down and your personal business out of the neighboring lawns/properties.
- 2. Do not overload your garbage can or you may be subject to overcharge fees for overloading or quite possibly the trash can may not get can dumped. If this happens the result is that you have to unload the overloaded waste and being charged an off route fee for us to come back. If you overload your waste it will end up on the ground save yourself time and added clean up.
- 3. If you find that you need an additional garbage can we have options that are better than overloading your can both capacity and price wise! Call us for options.
