

# SPRING CLEAN UP 2026

## 2026 EVENT CHANGES

- 1. APPLIANCES WITH COMPRESSORS – ABSOLUTELY NO APPLIANCES WITH COMPRESSORS &/OR REFRIGERANT WILL BE ACCEPTED AT THE LANDFILL. THEY MUST BE TAKEN TO THE 640 COUNTY RD RECYCLE DEPOT.**
- 2. TIRES – ALL WASTE TIRES WILL INCUR FEES. PASSENGER CAR/SUV \$8 EA, PASSENGER TRUCK \$12 EA. LIMIT 4 PER TICKET. ABSOLUTELY NO TIRES ON THE RIM ACCEPTED.**
- 3. WEIGHT ALLOWANCE LIMIT REDUCED – 500 LBS. TOTAL MAXIMUM WASTE LOAD ALLOWED PER TICKET. LOADS OVER 500 LBS. WILL INCUR FEES OF \$15 PER EACH ADDITIONAL 500 LBS.**

Your landfill ticket will be included in your utility bill. Each customer with active CITY refuse service at the time of billing prior to the event will receive ONE ticket for this event.

\*Please stop and recycle allowed recyclable items at the County Rd depot before making your way to the landfill.

\*No E-waste accepted (televisions, computers, printers, etc.) – Please E-cycle them. It is FREE! Call for information.

\* No automotive or lithium-ion batteries allowed. – Please recycle them. Most locations that sell new ones will take your old ones.

\*All loads must be covered & secured - fee may be charged on loads not secured or tarped.

\*Customers are required to unload their own waste as directed by the site monitor.

\*Customers must have utility ticket & current utility bill.

\*Event is for city-refuse paying customers ONLY.

\*One ticket will be issued per customer in their bill during the weeks outlined below. If you do not have services billed during at such time, our next event will be in October or you can contact us for additional service options.

Have something you no longer need, but is still in good condition? Consider donating it, have a yard sale, post it online as FREE! Someone may find a treasure in your old item.


## 3. Refuse = trash

Items not recyclable at the depots or in decent condition to be reused will need to be taken to the landfill during the dates and times of this event only, if you wish to use this opportunity.

### RECYCLING OF YOUR OLD METAL ITEMS OFFERED ALL YEAR LONG!

Have an old appliance to get rid of? Try donating it if it still works. If not, we have a great option!

Haul it for free to our County Road Recycling Depot. Open year-round on Tuesday – Friday between 12 (Noon) and 4 p.m. or Saturday between 8 a.m. and 12 (Noon).

Also accepted at this location: scrap metal (appliances), aluminum, tin, glass, used residential motor oil, corrugated cardboard and newspaper!

During the year between these events, we also offer temporary additional garbage services to meet your needs.

- Please:
- Do not overload your garbage cans.
  - Bag and tie your trash.
  - Place the can with the opening facing the street by 6 a.m. on your collection day or the night before.
  - No computers or televisions at any time!
  - No tires allowed at any time!
  - No lithium-ion or rechargeable batteries!
